Executive Summary The past year has been transformative for our

organization as we officially

transitioned from the I Will Mentorship Foundation to doing business as STEMCAT: STEM Community Advancement and Training. This change was driven by our desire to more accurately reflect the expanded scope and impact of our work, particularly in the areas of science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM). The rebranding to STEMCAT symbolizes our renewed commitment to equipping young adults with the skills they need to succeed in a rapidly evolving world. This year's accomplishments demonstrate the power of our mission and the collective effort of our community, volunteers, and supporters.

Our transition to STEMCAT has allowed us to sharpen our focus on STEM education while also broadening our reach. We have successfully launched new programs and expanded existing ones, serving over 500 young adults across our various initiatives. Our programs now run from October to September, allowing us to strategically plan and implement our activities to maximize impact and continuity throughout the year.

One of our most significant achievements this year has been the expansion of the **STEMCAT Mentorship Program**. This program has become a cornerstone of our efforts to foster curiosity, critical thinking, and innovation among young adults in our community. Through weekly mentorship sessions, we have seen measurable improvements in our participants' STEM subject performance and an increased interest in pursuing STEM-related careers. This program has not only provided educational support but has also built lasting relationships between mentors and mentees, creating a strong network of support and encouragement.

In addition to our mentorship program, we introduced new vocational workforce development classes, focusing on high-demand trades such as drone technology for agriculture and welding. These classes have been instrumental in providing young adults with practical skills that are directly applicable to the workforce. The success of these programs is evident in the increased enrollment and certification rates, which have equipped our participants with the qualifications they need to secure employment in rapidly growing industries.

Our **Summer STEM Camp** has continued to be a highlight of our annual programming. This week-long camp offers young adults hands-on experiences in advanced STEM fields, providing them with the opportunity

to explore subjects in-depth and gain practical knowledge. The overwhelming positive feedback from participants, with 90% reporting high levels of satisfaction, underscores the camp's effectiveness in sparking interest and excitement about STEM careers.

Another major initiative this year was the launch of our **Community Resilience Initiative.** This program focuses on sustainable farming and food production, addressing critical issues such as food security and environmental stewardship in our community. Through this initiative, we engaged over 50 community volunteers who contributed to the production of more than 2,000 pounds of fresh produce. This food was distributed to local food banks and community members in need, providing not only nourishment but also education on sustainable agricultural practices and health. The initiative also included a series of educational classes on topics such as composting, soil health, and advanced agricultural techniques, which have empowered participants with the knowledge to make a positive impact on their environment. Looking forward, we are excited about our plans for continued growth and expansion. One of the most significant developments on the horizon is the transition to the **STEMCAT Center**, a new 20,000 square foot building that will serve as the hub for all our educational and community initiatives. This state-of-the-art facility will dramatically increase our capacity, allowing us to offer more programs, reach more young adults, and deepen our impact in the region. The new center is part of a broader capital campaign that we are launching to ensure that we have the resources needed to bring this vision to life.

Furthermore, we are expanding our regional footprint to serve not only Lee, Charlotte, and Collier counties but also Hendry County. This expansion reflects our commitment to reaching underserved communities and ensuring that every young adult in the region has access to quality education and mentorship opportunities.

Programs and Outcomes

STEMCAT Mentorship Program

- Overview: Weekly mentorship sessions focused on STEM subjects, aimed at fostering curiosity and critical thinking among participants.
- Outcomes: Over 500 young adults participated, with measurable improvements in STEM subject performance and increased interest in STEM careers.

Summer STEM Camp

● **Overview:** A week-long camp offering hands-on experiences in advanced STEM fields. ● **Outcomes:** 90% of participants reported a high level of satisfaction, with many expressing a desire to pursue further education in STEM fields.

Vocational Workforce Development

- Overview: Expanded day and evening classes in high-demand trades such as drone technology for agriculture and welding.
- Outcomes: Increased enrollment and certification rates, with students gaining practical skills that are directly applicable to the workforce.

Community Resilience Initiative

● **Overview:** This initiative focuses on building community resilience through sustainable farming and food production. The program includes classes on agricultural practices, food sustainability, proper nutrition, mental health and environmental stewardship.

Goals:

- o Increase food security in the community by producing fresh, local produce. o Engage community members in sustainable farming practices.
- o Provide educational opportunities related to agriculture and environmental science.
- o Increase awareness of preventable diseases and mental health resources Outcomes:
 - o **Volunteers:** Over 50 community volunteers participated in farm activities. o **Food Produced:** The farm produced over 2,000 pounds of fresh produce, distributed to local food banks and community members in need.
 - o **Classes Offered:** Multiple classes were conducted on topics ranging from composting and soil health to advanced agricultural techniques.

- and community initiatives. This new space will allow us to dramatically increase our capacity, offering more programs, reaching more students, and expanding our impact in the region. We are launching a capital campaign to fund this transition, and we are confident that with your support, we will make this vision a reality.
- Regional Expansion: In addition to serving Lee, Charlotte, and Collier counties, we are expanding our reach to Hendry County. This expansion will allow us to bring our programs to more communities in need, ensuring that every young adult in the region has access to quality education and mentorship opportunities.
